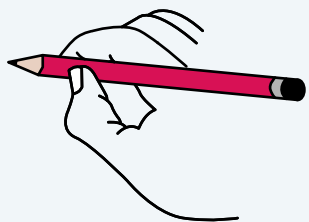




Buddhist Canon*	A collection of Buddhist scriptures, which includes the teachings and philosophies of the Buddha.
Dharma*	Rules or duties that help some people live well.
divine*	Connected to God or gods, often seen as very special or powerful.
guidance*	Advice about how to do something or for when making a decision.
Hadith*	A recorded saying or action of the Prophet Muhammad, providing guidance for Muslims.
holy*	Connected to God or religion, considered special and to be respected by followers.
revealed*	When something is shown or made known that was previously hidden or secret.
sacred	Something that is greatly respected, treated with care and connected to God.
translation*	The result of rewriting or speaking words in a different language so that people can understand them.
Vedas*	Hindu scriptures, filled with hymns, prayers and teachings.

Most organised religious worldviews have some form of scripture or trusted text which followers read, listen to or hear talks about to help them understand their worldview and make life choices.



There are many Hindu texts considered to be sacred. These may be considered to be shruti (divinely revealed) or smriti (remembered and passed down).



The Guru Granth Sahib is the central Sikh scripture and eternal Guru of the Sikhs. It is treated like a living Guru.



In the Buddhist worldview, there are many texts collectively called the Buddhist Canon. Texts vary between different traditions. Buddhist scripture may be referred to as Dharma.



The Qur'an is sacred to many Muslims and is also considered holy because it is believed to be the word of Allah.
